- > On September 23 at the Pleasantville library, we will have a special treat for members—a free Workshop with Melissa Leapman, Double Knitting a hat from 1-4 pm.

Follow-Up Instructions from Faina Goberstein

Swatch #1, Armhole and Neckline

There are 30 sts on your needles.

Neckline

Next Row (RS): Sl1, k10 for Left Front, BO next 8 sts for front neck, k11 for Right Front.

Place Left Front sts on holder.

Right Front

Next Row (WS): Sl1, purl to last st, k1.

Dec Row (RS): Sl1, k1, k2tog, knit to end—1 st

dec'd.

Repeat these two rows 4 more times ending

with WS row—6 sts.
Work 4 rows even.

BO all sts. Cut the yarn.

Left Front

With WS facing, join new yarn at neck edge.

Next Row (WS): Sl1, purl to last st, k1.

Dec Row (RS): Sl1, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—1 st dec'd.

Repeat these two rows 4 more times ending

with WS row—6 sts. Work 4 rows even.

BO all sts. Cut the yarn.

Swatch #2, V-neck prep work at home

There are 30 sts on your needle. Work WS row, if needed. Begin with RS row.

Next Row (RS): Sl1, k13, skip next st, k1 and keep it on left needle, knit the skipped st and drop both sts from left needle (sts are crossed), k14.

Slip first 15 worked sts on waste yarn or a stitch holder.

Right Front

Next Row (WS): Sl1, purl to last st, k1.

Dec Row (RS): Sl1, k1, k2tog, knit to end—1 st

Repeat these two rows 8 more times ending

with WS row—6 sts.

Work 4 rows even.

BO all sts. Cut the yarn.

Left Front

With WS facing, join new yarn at neck edge.

Next Row (WS): Sl1, purl to last st, k1.

Dec Row (RS): Sl1, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—1 st dec'd.

Repeat these two rows 8 more times ending with WS row—6 sts.
Work 4 rows even.
BO all sts. Cut the yarn.
